IMPLEMENTATION RESEARCH FOR TRANSFORMING PUBLIC HEALTH PRACTICE: FOCUS ON CHRONIC CONDITIONS.

India is experiencing a high burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) and mental health disorders, now recognized as the leading contributors to adult morbidity and mortality nationally. National Family Health Survey-5 (2019–21) reveals significant regional variation in health status and service utilization, reflecting persistent inequities in access to care and program delivery. Without urgent, evidence-based solutions, the prevailing inequities will undermine India's demographic dividend and national development. In India's complex health system, characterized by diversity in infrastructure, resource availability, and cultural backgrounds, public health professionals must translate evidence into high-impact, sustainable action.

Strengthening implementation research capacity is essential to advance towards Sustainable Development Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-being). By supporting the delivery and scaling of interventions that reflect community needs and accommodate the diversity of India's health systems, such capacity-building accelerates national progress.

This implementation research workshop, led by a team with experience in implementation research and advocacy, will equip participants with systematic, evidence-based methods for identifying barriers and enablers, customizing interventions, and assessing the effectiveness of integrated NCD and mental health initiatives in real-world settings. These skills are critical for enhancing the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NPNCD) and the National Mental Health Programme (NMHP), thereby addressing the gaps and priorities revealed by national data.
